

GLENDON Certificate in English-Spanish/Spanish-English Translation

The Department of Hispanic Studies offers a Certificate in English-Spanish/Spanish-English Translation. Applicants to the Certificate must successfully complete an entrance examination before engaging in their course of study.

Applicants to the Certificate must:

- a) have completed, by September, a minimum of one year of university study, or equivalent, including GL/SP 3000 6.00 (formerly GL/SP 2610 6.00) or AS/SP 3000 6.00, or the equivalent; and
- b) present a 5.0 (C+) average to be eligible for admission

Internal applicants (students currently enrolled in a Bachelor of Arts program at York University) who will not graduate prior to entering into the Certificate program must be eligible to proceed in an Honours BA program in combination with the Certificate.

External applicants must meet the Glendon/York University admission requirements and must be enrolled in a BA program in combination with the Certificate.

Applicants who will have completed, or who have already completed, a BA at York University or at another accredited institution before entering the Certificate program, will be admitted as direct entry candidates, provided all other Certificate entry requirements are met.

The Certificate in English/Spanish, Spanish/English Translation requires the successful completion of 33 credits, at least 27 of which must be at the 2000 level or higher. A minimum of 15 of the 33 required credits must be completed at Glendon College in order to be eligible for the Certificate. To receive the certificate, *students must achieve a minimum grade of C in each course, with a minimum cumulative average of 5.0 (C+) for the courses in the Certificate program.*

NOTE: Students are responsible for meeting requirements in effect **at the time of admission/re-admission to the program.** They are also responsible for their course enrolment, and for ensuring that all degree and program requirements are met.
