# Should I take courses that are taught in French?

This document mostly contains courses that are taught in English. **If you are already fluent in French**, you can consult the Enrolment Checklist document in French for additional course options.

**If French is not your dominant language**, you should first consider your ability in the following areas before selecting courses taught in French:

- Your ability to understand a lecture that is taught in the French
- Your ability to participate in class discussions in French
- Your ability to keep up with weekly readings in French
- Your ability to conduct research using French resources
- Your ability to Write university papers in French

Students come to Glendon with different levels of French knowledge. As a reference point, *some* students start to feel comfortable taking their discipline courses in French with a placement level of GL/FSL 1210.
