



## IMMIGRATION

<b>Study Permit</b>	<p>A Canadian Study Permit is <b>mandatory for all students who come to study full-time for more than 6 months</b> (for exceptions, <a href="#">please consult</a>). Students should apply for their study permit as soon as they receive their acceptance letter from York University. <b>Passport</b>	<p>Before applying for a study permit, students must ensure that their passport is valid for at least 3 months after the end of your program. Otherwise, all immigration documents will all expire at the same time the passport expires.</p>
<b>Temporary Resident Visa (TRV)</b>	<p>Students from certain countries will need to obtain a Temporary Resident Visa (TRV). Please consult Immigration, Refugee and Citizenship Canada IRCC website to find out if you are eligible for a <a href="#">TRV - IRCC</a>.</p> <p>When your study permit application is approved, a Temporary Resident Visa will be issued to you on your passport. You will receive the study permit at the Port of Entry upon arrival at the airport.</p>
<b>Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA)</b>	<p>All visa-exempt foreign nationals travelling to or transiting through Canada by air must apply for an eTA through the electronic system before entering Canada.</p> <p>This requirement does not apply to foreign nationals travelling to or transiting through Canada by land, sea or rail.</p> <p>An eTA is required for all visa-exempt foreign nationals, except United States (U.S.) citizens and <a href="#">certain other small groups</a></p> <p>Please, consult the list of countries concerned and apply to <a href="#">eTA -IRCC</a></p>
